1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 326B.082, subdivision 6, is amended to read:
1.8	Subd. 6. Notices of violation. (a) The commissioner may issue a notice of violation to
1.9	any person who the commissioner determines has committed a violation of the applicable
1.10	law. The notice of violation must state a summary of the facts that constitute the violation
1.11	and the applicable law violated. The notice of violation may require the person to correct
1.12	the violation. If correction is required, the notice of violation must state the deadline by
1.13	which the violation must be corrected.
1.14	(b) The commissioner shall issue the notice of violation by:
1.15	(1) serving the notice of violation on the property owner or on the person who committed
1.16	the violation; or
1.17	(2) posting the notice of violation at the location where the violation occurred.
1.18	(c) If the person to whom the commissioner has issued the notice of violation believes
1.19	the notice was issued in error, then the person may request reconsideration of the parts of
1.20	the notice that the person believes are in error. The request for reconsideration must be in
1.21	writing and must be served on <del>or,</del> faxed, or e-mailed to the commissioner at the address <del>or</del> ,
1.22	fax number, or e-mail address specified in the notice of violation by the tenth day after the

is served by mail shall be the postmark date on the envelope in which the request for 2.1 reconsideration is mailed. If the person does not serve or, fax, or e-mail a written request 2.2 for reconsideration or if the person's written request for reconsideration is not served on or 2.3 faxed to the commissioner by the tenth day after the commissioner issued the notice of 2.4 violation, the notice of violation shall become a final order of the commissioner and will 2.5 not be subject to review by any court or agency. The request for reconsideration must: 2.6 (1) specify which parts of the notice of violation the person believes are in error; 2.7 (2) explain why the person believes the parts are in error; and 2.8

2.9 (3) provide documentation to support the request for reconsideration.

The commissioner shall respond in writing to requests for reconsideration made under this paragraph within 15 days after receiving the request. A request for reconsideration does not stay a requirement to correct a violation as set forth in the notice of violation. After reviewing the request for reconsideration, the commissioner may affirm, modify, or rescind the notice of violation. The commissioner's response to a request for reconsideration is final and shall not be reviewed by any court or agency.

Subd. 8. Hearings related to administrative orders. (a) Within 30 days after the 2.17 commissioner issues an administrative order or within 20 days after the commissioner issues 2.18 the notice under section 326B.083, subdivision 3, paragraph (b), clause (3), the person to 2.19 whom the administrative order or notice is issued may request an expedited hearing to 2.20 review the commissioner's order or notice. The request for hearing must be in writing and 2.21 must be served on or, faxed, or e-mailed to the commissioner at the address or, fax number, 2.22 or e-mail address specified in the order or notice. If the person does not request a hearing 2.23 or if the person's written request for hearing is not served on or, faxed, or e-mailed to the 2.24 commissioner by the 30th day after the commissioner issues the administrative order or the 2.25 20th day after the commissioner issues the notice under section 326B.083, subdivision 3, 2.26 paragraph (b), clause (3), the order will become a final order of the commissioner and will 2.27 not be subject to review by any court or agency. (b) Parties may submit written arguments if permitted by the administrative law judge.
All written arguments must be submitted within ten days following the completion of the
hearing or the receipt of any late-filed exhibits that the parties and the administrative law
judge have agreed should be received into the record, whichever is later. The hearing shall
be conducted under Minnesota Rules, parts 1400.8510 to 1400.8612, as modified by this
subdivision. The Office of Administrative Hearings may, in consultation with the agency,
adopt rules specifically applicable to cases under this section.

3.10 (c) The administrative law judge shall issue a report making findings of fact, conclusions
3.11 of law, and a recommended order to the commissioner within 30 days following the
3.12 completion of the hearing, the receipt of late-filed exhibits, or the submission of written
3.13 arguments, whichever is later.

3.14 (d) If the administrative law judge makes a finding that the hearing was requested solely
3.15 for purposes of delay or that the hearing request was frivolous, the commissioner may add
3.16 to the amount of the penalty the costs charged to the department by the Office of
3.17 Administrative Hearings for the hearing.

(e) If a hearing has been held, the commissioner shall not issue a final order until at least
five days after the date of the administrative law judge's report. Any person aggrieved by
the administrative law judge's report may, within those five days, serve written comments
to the commissioner on the report and the commissioner shall consider and enter the
comments in the record. The commissioner's final order shall comply with sections 14.61,
subdivision 2, and 14.62, subdivisions 1 and 2a, and may be appealed in the manner provided
in sections 14.63 to 14.69.

4.1 (b) Any order issued under paragraph (a) may include an assessment of monetary penalties
and may require the person to cease and desist from committing the violation or committing
the act, conduct, or practice set out in subdivision 11, paragraph (b). The monetary penalty
may be up to \$10,000 for each violation or act, conduct, or practice committed by the person.
The procedures in section 326B.083 must be followed when issuing orders under paragraph
(a).

(c) The permit holder, licensee, registrant, certificate holder, or applicant to whom the 4.7 commissioner issues an order under paragraph (a) shall have 30 days after issuance of the 4.8 order to request a hearing. 5.2 Subd. 4. **Renewal; use period for license.** (a) A restricted master plumber and restricted 5.3 journeyworker plumber license must be renewed for as long as that licensee engages in the 5.4 plumbing trade. Notwithstanding section 326B.094, failure to renew a restricted master 5.5 plumber and restricted journeyworker plumber license within 12 months after the expiration 5.6 date will result in permanent forfeiture of the restricted master plumber and restricted 5.7 journeyworker plumber license.

(b) The commissioner shall in a manner determined by the commissioner, without the
need for any rulemaking under chapter 14, phase in the renewal of restricted master plumber
and restricted journeyworker plumber licenses from one year to two years. By June 30,
2011, all restricted master plumber and restricted journeyworker plumber licenses shall be
two-year licenses.

#### 325F.75 ADVERTISING RESTRICTIONS; SCOPE; PENALTIES.

Subdivision 1. **Restrictions.** Except as provided in this section, where a plumbing license is required under section 326B.46, no person offering plumbing services may do any of the following unless the person employs a licensed master plumber or the person is a licensed master or journeyman plumber:

(1) advertise as a plumbing contractor, master plumber, journeyman plumber, or plumber;

(2) append the person's name to, or in connection with, the title "plumbing contractor," "master plumber," "journeyman plumber," or "plumber";

(3) append the person's name to any other words that tend to represent the person as a plumbing contractor, master plumber, journeyman plumber, or plumber.

A person who advertises as a master plumber shall include in the advertisement the number of the person's license as a master plumber. A person who advertises as a journeyman plumber must include in the advertisement the person's master or journeyman plumber license number. A person who advertises as a plumbing contractor shall include in the advertisement the license number of the master plumber employed by the plumbing contractor.

A vehicle used to conduct plumbing business must prominently display on its exterior the license number of the master plumber or journeyman plumber performing plumbing services.

Subd. 2. **Scope.** (a) This section applies to a person advertising plumbing services if that person engages in or works at the business of plumbing or offers plumbing services in a city of 5,000 or more population.

(b) This section also applies to a person advertising plumbing services who engages in or works at the business of plumbing or offers plumbing services in a city of less than 5,000 in population that by ordinance requires licensing to do business as a master or journeyman plumber.

Subd. 3. **Penalties.** (a) A person who is found guilty of violating subdivision 1 is subject to a fine not to exceed \$200 for the first offense.

(b) A person who is found guilty of violating subdivision 1 is subject to a fine not to exceed \$1,000 for the second offense.

(c) A person who is found guilty of violating subdivision 1 is subject to a fine not to exceed \$1,000 or imprisonment not to exceed 30 days, or both, for the third and subsequent offenses.
