1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. [626.8469] SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Qualifications. The commissioner of public safety, in consultation with
1.8	stakeholders in juvenile justice, education, and child development, shall establish the
1.9	qualifications that a peace officer must have to work as a school resource officer that include,
1.10	at a minimum, that the officer:
1.11	(1) likes, cares about, and wants to work, and is able to work, with children and
1.12	adolescents;
1.13	(2) has good communication skills, including, at a minimum, interpersonal communication
1.14	and public speaking skills;
1.15	(3) has experience as a patrol officer or road deputy;
1.16	(4) is able to work independently with little supervision;
1.17	(5) is exceptionally dependable;
1.18	(6) is willing to work very hard;
1.19	(7) is or can become an effective teacher;
1.20	(8) has above-average integrity;

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(9) possesses knowledge of school-based legal issues and issues of child and adolescent
development and psychology; and
(10) possesses knowledge of school safety and its implementation.
Subd. 2. Training course; de-escalation; child and adolescent development. The
board, in consultation with the Department of Public Safety and the National Association
of School Resource Officers, shall develop lists of approved training courses to instruct
school resource officers in each of the following:
(1) the techniques and practices to de-escalate and resolve crises; and
(2) childhood and adolescent development.
Subd. 3. Training requirement. (a) Beginning January 1, 2018, a school resource officer
shall complete a minimum of four hours of continuing education training every three years
in each of the following:
(1) crisis de-escalation; and
(2) child and adolescent development.
(b) Beginning July 1, 2018, a peace officer is not eligible to work as a school resource
officer unless the officer has attended at least one course in each of the training requirements
in paragraph (a).
Subd. 4. Report. The commissioner of public safety shall report annually to the chairs
and ranking minority members of the senate and house of representatives committees and
divisions having jurisdiction over public safety, kindergarten through grade 12 education,
and human services on or before March 15 on the work of school resource officers including,
at a minimum:
(1) the number of school resource officers working in the state and the names of the
schools and school districts where they are working;
(2) the number of juvenile arrests and the names of the schools and school districts,
where the arrests occurred, and the reason for the arrests; and
(3) the number of incidents that involved the use of force by the school resource officer
and the names of the schools and school districts where the force occurred, and the reason
for the use of force.
