A candidate may not authorize, designate, or cause to be formed any 1.10 other political committee bearing the candidate's name or title or otherwise operating under 1.11 the direct or indirect control of the candidate. - (b) Once registered, control of a candidate's principal campaign committee may not be
 transferred to another candidate. Assets of a principal campaign committee may only be
 transferred to another candidate's principal campaign committee to the extent expressly
 authorized by this chapter.
- 2.10 (b) (c) This subdivision does not apply to ballot question or independent expenditure political committees or funds, which are subject to subdivision 1a.

Sec. 3. **EFFECTIVE DATE.**

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Sections 1 and 2 are effective the day following final enactment, and apply to principal campaign committees with active registrations on that date, or that are registered on or after that date.
