| 1.12       | (1) a student receiving special instruction under Minnesota Statutes, section 125A.03,  |

| 2.1  | Subd. 3. Services. Eligible providers wishing to participate in the pilot must notify the     |
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| 2.2  | commissioner, on a form designated by the commissioner, of the intent to provide an eligible  |
| 2.3  | student with one of the following services:   |
| 2.4  | (1) comprehensive job preparation training that must provide an eligible student with at      |
| 2.5  | least 20 hours in a classroom setting, resume preparation, and assistance in establishing a   |
| 2.6  | bank account;   |
| 2.7  | (2) job shadowing experiences where eligible students can observe at least 30 hours of        |
| 2.8  | workplace activity for a job similar to one the eligible student might be hired for. Eligible |

| 3.3  | (a) \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$2,000,000 in fiscal year 2021 are appropriated     |
| 3.4  | from the general fund to the commissioner of employment and economic development for         |
| 3.5  | payments to eligible providers under the special education employment pilot project created  |
| 3.6  | in section 1. Of these amounts, up to four percent may be used by the commissioner for       |
| 3.7  | administration and monitoring of the program. This is a onetime appropriation and funds      |

| 3.9  | (b) By January 15 in 2020, 2021, and 2022, the commissioner must submit a report to          |
