1.8	Section 1. COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH; LONG-TERM CARE PROTECTION
1.9	AND SUPPORT ACTIVITIES; APPROPRIATIONS.
1.10	Subdivision 1. COVID-19 testing and vaccinations in long-term care
1.11	facilities. \$2,108,000 in fiscal year 2021 is appropriated from the general fund to the
1.12	commissioner of health for:
1.13	(1) contracts for teams to provide COVID-19 test specimen collection and vaccination
1.14	services to long-term care facilities; and
1.15	(2) activities of staff at the State Emergency Operations Center to support COVID-19

3.2	POOL; APPROPRIATION.
3.3	(a) \$2,000,000 in fiscal year 2021 is appropriated from the general fund to the
3.4	commissioner of human services to contract with third-party staffing entities, for the
3.5	contracted third-party staffing entities to recruit, hire, train, and employ a temporary staffing
3.6	pool. These temporary staff, at the request of the commissioner, may be deployed to
3.7	long-term care facilities and other group residential facilities and programs experiencing a
3.8	COVID-19-related staffing crisis on or after the effective date of this section. These
3.9	temporary staff must be provided at no cost to the facility or program receiving the temporary
3.10	staff.
3.11	(b) Members of the temporary staffing pool described in this section are not state
3.12	employees.
3.13	(c) The commissioner must coordinate the activities described in this section with the
3.14	commissioner of health, the commissioner of the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency, and
3.15	the State Emergency Operations Center to appropriately prioritize locations to deploy
3.16	contracted temporary staff for up to 14 days. The commissioner must give priority for
3.17	deploying staff to facilities and programs with the most significant staffing crises.
3.18	(d) A facility or program may seek assistance from the temporary staffing pool only
3.19	after the facility or program has used all resources available to obtain temporary staff but
3.20	is unable to meet the facility's or program's temporary staffing needs.
3.21	(e) As a condition of receiving staffing assistance from the temporary staffing pool, a
3.22	facility or program must provide employees a total of at least 80 hours of paid leave, prorated
3.23	for part-time employees, to be used if the employee must isolate or quarantine due to
3.24	COVID-19 infection or exposure, except as provided in paragraph (f). Paid leave provided
3.25	under this paragraph must be paid at the employee's regular salary or wages.

5.24	section 256E.36. Grant money may be used to:
5.25	(1) provide housing that promotes health and safety or to isolate homeless individuals
5.26	exposed to COVID-19 or who are experiencing a respiratory illness, including grant money
5.27	to provide additional shelter space, to purchase vouchers for the cost of a motel or hotel
5.28	room, or to fund other housing options. Vouchers for the cost of a motel or hotel room must
5.29	not be issued to motels or hotels that receive funding from another source for the cost of
5.30	the same motel or hotel room for the same date;

APPROPRIATION; ISOLATION SPACES. 6.19 6.20 (a) \$4,306,000 in fiscal year 2021 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of human services to establish and maintain isolation spaces for suspected 6.21 or confirmed COVID-19-positive individuals who are experiencing homelessness or who 6.22 cannot safely isolate at home and who do not require a hospital level of care. 6.23 (b) The commissioner of human services may enter into contracts or directly purchase 6.24 goods or services necessary to provide isolation spaces or services related to establishing 6.25 or maintaining such spaces. Sec. 3. <u>APPROPRIATION; HOUSING SUPPORT.</u> (a) \$4,235,000 in fiscal year 2021 is appropriated from the general fund to the
commissioner of human services to increase room and board rates under Minnesota Statutes,
chapter 256I, by 10.7 percent for purposes of maintaining access to room and board, including
activities necessary to comply with federal and state health and safety guidance in response
to the COVID-19 pandemic. This is a onetime appropriation.
(b) Prior to July 1, 2021, providers must submit documentation to the commissioner of
human services demonstrating increased funding was used for needs related to COVID-19
for the time period during which the money appropriated under this section was expended.
<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective the day following final enactment.
