1.2 relating to public safety; appropriating money for corrections and public safety.

1.3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.4 Section 1. APPROPRIATIONS.

1.5 The sums shown in the column under "APPROPRIATIONS" are added to or reduce the
1.6 appropriations in Laws 2019, First Special Session chapter 5, to the agencies and for the
1.7 purposes specified in this act. The appropriations are from the general fund, or another
1.8 named fund, and are available for the fiscal year indicated for each purpose.

1.18 Subd. 2. Correctional Institutions 481,000 7,419,000

1.19 (a) Corrections Overtime and Staffing

1.20 \$481,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$9,888,000
1.21 in fiscal year 2021 are for additional
1.22 compensation costs, including overtime. The
1.23 base for this appropriation is \$12,338,000 in

2.1 fiscal year 2022 and \$12,338,000 in fiscal year  
2.2 2023.

2.3 **(b) Prison Population Reduction**

2.4 A base reduction of \$2,469,000 in fiscal year  
2.5 2021 is for an anticipated reduction in state  
2.6 prison beds needed by using community-based  
2.7 alternatives for supervision revocations. The  
2.8 base reduction is \$4,938,000 in fiscal year  
2.9 2022 and \$7,407,000 in fiscal year 2023.

2.11 **(a) Investments in Community Supervision**  
2.12 **Partners**

2.13 \$3,925,000 in fiscal year 2021 is added to the  
2.14 Community Corrections Act subsidy under  
2.15 Minnesota Statutes, section 401.14. The base  
2.16 for this appropriation is \$4,911,000 in fiscal  
2.17 year 2022 and \$4,911,000 in fiscal year 2023.

2.18 \$310,000 in fiscal year 2021 is for county  
2.19 probation officer reimbursement under  
2.20 Minnesota Statutes, section 244.19,  
2.21 subdivision 6.

2.22 \$205,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$430,000 in  
2.23 fiscal year 2021 are to provide offender  
2.24 supervision services in Meeker and Renville  
2.25 Counties. These expenditures must be offset  
2.26 by revenue to the general fund collected under  
2.27 Minnesota Statutes, section 244.19,  
2.28 subdivision 5.

2.29 \$422,000 in fiscal year 2021 is to increase  
2.30 offender supervision by the Department of  
2.31 Corrections. The base for this appropriation  
2.32 is \$844,000 in fiscal year 2022 and \$844,000  
2.33 in fiscal year 2023.

3.1 \$2,613,000 in fiscal year 2021 is to establish  
 3.2 county and regional revocation intervention  
 3.3 service centers for offenders who would  
 3.4 otherwise be returned to prison. The base for  
 3.5 this appropriation is \$5,100,000 in fiscal year  
 3.6 2022 and \$5,100,000 in fiscal year 2023.

3.7 \$365,000 in fiscal year 2021 is for cognitive  
 3.8 behavioral treatment, for community-based  
 3.9 sex offender treatment, and to increase housing  
 3.10 alternatives for offenders under community  
 3.11 supervision. The base for this appropriation  
 3.12 is \$730,000 in fiscal year 2022 and \$730,000  
 3.13 in fiscal year 2023.

3.14 **(b) Corrections Overtime and Staffing**

3.15 \$338,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$1,268,000  
 3.16 in fiscal year 2021 are for additional  
 3.17 compensation costs, including overtime.

3.27 \$3,096,000 in fiscal year 2021 is to pay for  
 3.28 the testing of unrestricted sexual assault  
 3.29 examination kits, storage of restricted kits, and  
 3.30 the development of an informational website  
 3.31 for sexual assault survivors to learn the status  
 3.32 of the testing of the survivor's individual  
 3.33 sexual assault examination kit. The base for

4.1 this appropriation is \$2,067,000 in fiscal year  
4.2 2022 and each year thereafter.

4.3 **(b) Laboratory Capacity Support to Combat**  
4.4 **Violent Crime**

4.5 \$1,386,000 in fiscal year 2021 is for staffing  
4.6 and operating costs to provide for training,  
4.7 supplies, and equipment; and renovate space  
4.8 to enhance the capacity for forensic testing to  
4.9 combat violent crime. The base for this  
4.10 appropriation is \$844,000 in fiscal year 2022  
4.11 and each year thereafter.
