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(e) To be eligible to receive a collaborative urban educator program grant, a grant recipient must include instruction on African American history, culture, and heritage in the content and methods courses and student teaching practicum that are part of the grant recipient's teacher preparation program. A grant recipient must use a program developed by a recognized teachers' forum to provide the instruction, related coursework, and professional development required under this paragraph.
