1.8	Subdivision 1. Requirements for services. (a) The commissioner of health shall
1.9	administer, or contract for the administration of, statewide tobacco cessation services to
1.10	assist Minnesotans who are seeking advice or services to help them quit using tobacco
1.11	products. The commissioner shall establish statewide public awareness activities to inform
1.12	the public of the availability of the services and encourage the public to utilize the services
1.13	because of the dangers and harm of tobacco use and dependence.
1.14	(b) Services to be provided may include, but are not limited to:
1.15	(1) telephone-based coaching and counseling;
1.16	(2) referrals;
1.17	(3) written materials mailed upon request;
1.18	(4) Web-based texting or e-mail services; and
1.19	(5) free Food and Drug Administration-approved tobacco cessation medications.
1.20	(c) Services provided must be consistent with evidence-based best practices in tobacco
1.21	cessation services. Services provided must be coordinated with employer, health plan
