1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 256B.093, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

1.7 Subdivision 1. State traumatic brain injury program. (a) The commissioner of human
1.8 services shall:

1.9 (1) maintain a statewide traumatic brain injury program;

1.10 (2) supervise and coordinate services and policies for persons with traumatic brain
1.11 injuries;

1.12 (3) contract with qualified agencies or employ staff to provide statewide administrative
1.13 case management and consultation;

1.14 (4) maintain an advisory committee to provide recommendations in reports to the
1.15 commissioner regarding program and service needs of persons with brain injuries;

1.16 (5) investigate the need for the development of rules or statutes for the brain injury home
1.17 and community-based services waiver; and

1.18 (6) investigate present and potential models of service coordination which can be
1.19 delivered at the local level; and.

1.20 (7) (b) The advisory committee required by paragraph (a), clause (4), must consist of
1.21 no fewer than ten members and no more than 30 members. The commissioner shall appoint

- 2.1 all advisory committee members to one- or two-year terms and appoint one member as
- 2.2 chair. The advisory committee ~~does not terminate until~~ expires on June 30, 2018 2023.
