(e) "Individually identifiable form" means a form in which the patient is or can be identified as the subject of the health records.

- (f) "Medical emergency" means medically necessary care which is immediately needed to preserve life, prevent serious impairment to bodily functions, organs, or parts, or prevent placing the physical or mental health of the patient in serious jeopardy.
- (g) "Patient" means a natural person who has received health care services from a provider for treatment or examination of a medical, psychiatric, or mental condition, the surviving spouse and parents of a deceased patient, or a person the patient appoints in writing as a representative, including a health care agent acting according to chapter 145C, unless the authority of the agent has been limited by the principal in the principal's health care directive. Except for minors who have received health care services under sections 144.341 to 144.347, In the case of a minor, patient includes a parent or guardian, or a person acting as a parent or guardian in the absence of a parent or guardian-, except:
- 2.14 (1) for minors who have received health care services under section 144.341, 144.342, or 144.344; and
- 2.16 (2) for minors who are age 16 or older and who have received health care services under section 144.343, subdivision 1, or section 144.3441.
