1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 609.324, subdivision 3, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 3. General prostitution crimes; penalties for patrons. (a) Whoever, while acting
1.8	as a patron, intentionally does any of the following is guilty of a misdemeanor:
1.9	(1) engages in prostitution with an individual 18 years of age or older; or
1.10	(2) hires, offers to hire, or agrees to hire an individual 18 years of age or older to engage
1.11	in sexual penetration or sexual contact. Except as otherwise provided in subdivision 4, a
1.12	person who is convicted of violating this paragraph must, at a minimum, be sentenced to
1.13	pay a fine of at least \$500 <u>\$750</u> .
1.14	(b) Whoever violates the provisions of this subdivision within two years of a previous
1.15	prostitution conviction for violating this section or section 609.322 is guilty of a gross
1.16	misdemeanor. Except as otherwise provided in subdivision 4, a person who is convicted of
1.17	violating this paragraph must, at a minimum, be sentenced as follows:
1.18	(1) to pay a fine of at least \$1,500; and
1.19	(2) to serve 20 hours of community work service.
