	propriations and transfers from the general fund in Laws 2020, chapters 66, 70, 71,
	4, to determine whether those appropriations and transfers are eligible expenditures
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from the coronavirus relief federal fund. The commissioner shall designate a total amount 4.1 of general fund appropriations and transfers in Laws 2020, chapters 66, 70, 71, and 74, up 4.2 to but not greater than the amount determined under subdivision 1, to be an eligible 4.3 expenditure from the coronavirus relief federal fund. All appropriations and transfers 4.4 designed by the commissioner in an amount up to, but not greater than the amount returned 4.5 as provided under subdivision 1, are canceled to the general fund. The commissioner may 4.6 designate a portion of an appropriation or transfer for cancellation. Each amount designated 4.7 under this subdivision is appropriated from the coronavirus relief federal fund for the 4.8 purposes of the original general fund appropriation. 4.9
