1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT RESTRUCTURING WORKING
1.6	<u>GROUP.</u>
1.7	Subdivision 1. Establishment; membership. (a) A working group to consider
1.8	restructuring the Department of Human Services is established.
1.9	(b) The working group shall include 17 members as follows:
1.10	(1) two members of the house of representatives, one appointed by the speaker of the
1.11	house and one appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives;
1.12	(2) two members of the senate, one appointed by the senate majority leader and one
1.13	appointed by the senate minority leader;
1.14	(3) the legislative auditor or a designee;
1.15	(4) the commissioner of administration or a designee;
1.16	(5) two representatives from county social services agencies, appointed by the
1.17	commissioner of human services;
1.18	(6) two representatives from tribal social services agencies, appointed by the
1.19	commissioner of human services;

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	(7) two representatives from organizations that represent people served by programs
adn	ninistered by the Department of Human Services, appointed by the commissioner of
hun	nan services;
	(8) two representatives from organizations that represent service providers that are either
lice	nsed or reimbursed by the Department of Human Services, appointed by the commissioner
of h	uman services;
	(9) one member representing the Cultural and Ethnic Communities Leadership Council,
app	ointed by the commissioner of human services; and
(	(10) two representatives of labor organizations, who must be full-time employees of the
Dep	partment of Human Services working in facilities located in different geographic regions
of t	he state, appointed by the governor.
	(c) The appointing authorities under this subdivision must complete their appointments
no l	ater than July 1, 2018.
	Subd. 2. Duties. The working group shall review the current structure of the Department
of F	Iuman Services and programs administered by that agency and propose a restructuring
oft	he agency to provide for better coordination and control of programs, accountability,
and	continuity. In making recommendations, the working group must consider:
	(1) how human services agencies are structured in other states;
	(2) transferring duties to other state agencies;
	(3) the effect of a restructuring on clients and counties;
-	(4) administrative efficiencies;
	(5) various analytical methods to evaluate efficiencies, including but not limited to
zero	b-based budgeting;
-	(6) budget and policy priorities;
	(7) program funding sources;
	(8) avoiding conflicting agency roles;
	(9) the extent to which the agency should provide direct services to clients;
	(10) eliminating any duplication of services; and
	(11) staffing issues.

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3.1	Subd. 3. Meetings. The legislative auditor or a designee shall convene the first meeting
3.2	of the working group no later than August 1, 2018. The legislative auditor or a designee
3.3	shall serve as the chair of the working group. Meetings of the working group are open to
3.4	the public.
3.5	Subd. 4. Compensation. Members of the working group shall serve without compensation
3.6	or reimbursement for expenses.
3.7	Subd. 5. Administrative support. The Legislative Coordinating Commission shall
3.8	provide administrative support for the working group and arrange for meeting space.
3.9	Subd. 6. <b>Report.</b> By, the working group must submit a report with findings,
3.10	recommendations, and draft legislation to the chairs and ranking minority members of the
3.11	legislative committees with jurisdiction over human services policy and finance. The report
3.12	must include a discussion of the costs and benefits associated with any proposed restructuring.
3.13	Subd. 7. Expiration. The working group expires or the day after the working group
3.14	submits the report required under subdivision 6, whichever is earlier.
3.15	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective the day following final enactment.
