1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. TITLE.
1.8	This act may be cited as the "Local Bus and Transit Improvement Act."
1.9	Sec. 2. TRANSIT SIGNAL PRIORITY SYSTEM PLANNING.
1.10	Subdivision 1. Establishment. By August 1, 2022, the Metropolitan Council must
1.11	convene a working group to perform planning on transit signal priority systems and related
1.12	transit advantage improvements on high-frequency and high-ridership bus routes in the
1.13	metropolitan area, as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 473.121, subdivision 2.
1.14	Subd. 2. Membership. The Metropolitan Council must solicit the following members
1.15	to participate in the working group:
1.16	(1) one member representing Metro Transit, appointed by the Metropolitan Council;
1.17	(2) one member representing the Department of Transportation, appointed by the
1.18	commissioner of transportation;
1.19	(3) one member representing Minneapolis, appointed by the Minneapolis City Council;
1.20	(4) one member representing St. Paul, appointed by the St. Paul City Council;

2.27	Subd. 6. Expiration. The work	ing group under this se	ction expires Decen	nber 31, 2022.
2.28	EFFECTIVE DATE; APPLIC	CATION. This section	is effective the day	following
2.29	final enactment and applies in the c	counties of Anoka, Car	rver, Dakota, Henne	pin, Ramsey,
2.30	Scott, and Washington.			

3.1	Sec. 3. TRANSIT FARE TEMPORARY REDUCTION.
3.2	(a) The Metropolitan Council must establish a uniform fare schedule from July 1, 2022,
3.3	to August 31, 2022, that does not exceed \$1 for all bus and light rail transit service during
3.4	peak and nonpeak service hours, including but not limited to express bus and bus rapid
3.5	transit. The Metropolitan Council may adjust any reduced, discounted, and circulation fares
3.6	accordingly.
3.7	(b) \$1,500,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the
3.8	Metropolitan Council for transit system operations under Minnesota Statutes, sections
3.9	473.371 to 473.449. This appropriation is to provide for foregone revenue due to the
3.10	requirements in paragraph (a). From this amount, the Metropolitan Council must provide
3.11	grants to replacement transit service providers under Minnesota Statutes, section 473.388,
3.12	in amounts that reflect calculated foregone revenue for each provider due to the requirements
3.13	in paragraph (a). This is a onetime appropriation.
3.14	(c) After accounting for foregone revenue, the Metropolitan Council may use any
3.15	remaining funds from the appropriation in paragraph (b) for transit shelter replacement and
3.16	improvements under Minnesota Statutes, section 473.41.
3.17	APPLICATION. This section applies in the counties of Anoka, Carver, Dakota,
3.18	Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott, and Washington.
3.19	Sec. 4. APPROPRIATION; TRANSIT SHELTER IMPROVEMENTS.
3.20	\$3,600,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the Metropolitan
3.21	Council for transit shelter replacement and improvements under Minnesota Statutes, section
3.22	473.41. This is a onetime appropriation.
3.23	Sec. 5. APPROPRIATION; ZERO-EMISSION BUS TRANSITION.
3.24	\$15,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the Metropolitan
3.25	Council for zero-emission bus procurement and associated costs in conformance with the
3.26	zero-emission and electric transit vehicle transition plan under Minnesota Statutes, section
3.27	473.3927. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until December 31, 2027.
3.28	Sec. 6. APPROPRIATION; ARTERIAL BUS RAPID TRANSIT PLANNING.
3.29	\$500,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the Metropolitan
3.30	Council for arterial bus rapid transit planning on the J, K, and L Line projects. \$250,000 in
3.31	each year is added to the base for transit system operations.
