The 2.2 itemized description of billed charges must not describe a billed charge using only a medical 2.3 or dental billing code, "miscellaneous charges," or "supply charges." 2.4 Subd. 3. Coordination. A hospital, outpatient surgical center, health clinic, or health 2.5 professional office may compile the itemized descriptions of billed charges for the services 2.6 and goods provided to a patient by individual health professionals employed by or under 2.7 contract with the hospital, outpatient surgical center, health clinic, or health professional 2.8 office, and may provide the patient with a single itemized description of billed charges from 2.9 that hospital, outpatient surgical center, health clinic, or health professional office. 2.10 Subd. 4. No charge to patient. (b) A hospital health care provider may not bill or 2.11 otherwise charge a patient for the itemized description of billed charges. 2.12 Subd. 5. Provision of itemized description.
