The Legislative Commission on Cybersecurity consists 1.7 of the following eight members: 1.8 (1) four senators, including two senators appointed by the senate majority leader and 1.9 two senators appointed by the senate minority leader; and 1.10 (2) four members of the house of representatives, including two members appointed by 1.11 the speaker of the house of representatives and two members appointed by the minority 1.12 leader of the house of representatives. 1.13 1.14 Subd. 2. Terms; vacancies. Members of the commission serve for a two-year term beginning upon appointment and expiring on appointment of a successor after the opening 1.15 of the next regular session of the legislature in the odd-numbered year. A vacancy in the 1.16 membership of the commission must be filled for the unexpired term in a manner that will 1.17 preserve the representation established by this section. 1.18 Subd. 3. **Duties.** The commission shall provide oversight of the state's cybersecurity 1.19 measures. The commission shall review the policies and practices of state agencies with 1.20 regard to cybersecurity and may recommend changes in policy and law to adequately protect 1.21
