- (1) the disability waivers under sections 256B.092 and 256B.49 support the presumption that adult Minnesotans with disabilities and families of children with disabilities can and want to use self-directed services and supports, including self-directed funding options; and
- (2) <u>lead agencies offer</u> each waiver recipient be offered, after an informed decision-making process and during a person-centered planning process, the opportunity to choose self-directed services and supports, including self-directed funding options, before being offered services and supports that are not self-directed.

- 2.20 Subd. 7. Enforcement. In the event that the commissioner determines that a lead agency
 2.21 has authorized disability services after a violation of clause (2) of subdivisions 2, 4, or 6,
 2.22 the commissioner shall recoup the cost of the assessment during which the violation occurred
 2.23 by reducing reimbursement to lead agencies under section 256B.0911, subdivision 6.
