Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 256D.01, subdivision 1a, is amended to read: 1.6 Subd. 1a. **Standards.** (a) A principal objective in providing general assistance is to 1.7 provide for single adults, childless couples, or children as defined in section 256D.02, 18 subdivision 6, ineligible for federal programs who are unable to provide for themselves. 19 The minimum standard of assistance determines the total amount of the general assistance 1.10 grant without separate standards for shelter, utilities, or other needs. 1.11 (b) The commissioner shall set the standard of assistance for an assistance unit consisting 1.12 of an adult recipient who is childless and unmarried or living apart from children and spouse 1.13 and who does not live with a parent or parents or a legal custodian. 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exceed the standard for a general assistance recipient living alone. Benefits received by a responsible relative of the assistance unit under the Supplemental Security Income program, a workers' compensation program, the Minnesota supplemental aid program, or any other program based on the responsible relative's disability, and any benefits received by a responsible relative of the assistance unit under the Social Security retirement program, may not be counted in the determination of eligibility or benefit level for the assistance unit. Except as provided below, the assistance unit is ineligible for general assistance if the available resources or the countable income of the assistance unit and the parent or parents with whom the assistance unit lives are such that a family consisting of the assistance unit's parent or parents, the parent or parents' other family members and the assistance unit as the only or additional minor child would be financially ineligible for general assistance. For the purposes of calculating the countable income of the assistance unit's parent or parents, the calculation methods must follow the provisions under section 256P.06.

- (d) For an assistance unit consisting of a childless couple, the standards of assistance are the same as the first and second adult standards of the aid to families with dependent children program in effect on July 16, 1996. If one member of the couple is not included in the general assistance grant, the standard of assistance for the other is the second adult standard of the aid to families with dependent children program as of July 16, 1996.

  - Subd. 5. **MFIP transitional standard.** (a) The MFIP transitional standard is based on the number of persons in the assistance unit eligible for both food and cash assistance. The amount of the transitional standard is published annually by the Department of Human Services.
- (b) Beginning in fiscal year 2021, the commissioner of human services shall adjust the
   cash assistance portion under paragraph (a) for inflation based on the CPI-U for the prior
   calendar year.
