1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 169.475, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.6	Subd. 2. Prohibition on use; penalty. (a) No person may operate a motor vehicle while
1.7	using a wireless communications device to compose, read, or send an electronic message,
1.8	when the vehicle is in motion or a part of traffic. A person who violates this paragraph must
1.9	pay a fine of \$125. This fine is in addition to the surcharge under section 357.021, subdivision
1.10	<u>6.</u>
1.11	(b) A person who violates paragraph (a) a second or subsequent time must pay a fine of
1.12	\$225, plus the amount specified in the uniform fine schedule established by the Judicial
