1.6	Section 1. [116J.8756] FEDERAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT
1.7	PROGRAM.
1.8	Subdivision 1. Establishment. A grant program is established to award grants to eligible
1.9	applicants in order to match funds received through the federal Small Business Innovation
1.10	Research (SBIR) and Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) programs.
1.11	Subd. 2. Eligible applicant. An eligible applicant is a company with headquarters in
1.12	Minnesota that receives grants or contracts, awarded after state fiscal year 2016, under:
1.13	(1) phase I of the federal SBIR or STTR program; or
1.14	(2) phase II of the federal SBIR or STTR program.
1.15	Subd. 3. Application process. An eligible applicant must submit an application to the
1.16	commissioner on a form prescribed by the commissioner.
1.17	Subd. 4. Limitation. No grant awarded to a recipient defined under subdivision 2, clause
1.18	(1), shall exceed \$250,000 per recipient per year. No grant awarded to a recipient under
1.19	subdivision 2, clause (2), shall exceed \$500,000 per recipient per year. Grants awarded to
1.20	a single entity shall not exceed \$750,000 per recipient per year.
