1.8	Subdivision 1. Purpose; membership. The Advisory Council on Water Supply Systems
1.9	and Wastewater Treatment Facilities advises the commissioners of health and the Pollution
1.10	Control Agency regarding classification of water supply systems and wastewater treatment
1.11	facilities; qualifications and competency evaluation of water supply system operators and
1.12	wastewater treatment facility operators; and additional statutes, rules, and procedures that
1.13	may be desirable for regulating the operation of water supply systems and wastewater
1.14	treatment facilities. The advisory council is composed of 11 voting members, of whom:
1.15	(1) one member must be from the Department of Health, Division of Environmental
1.16	Health, appointed by the commissioner of health;
1.17	(2) one member must be from the Pollution Control Agency, appointed by the
1.18	commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency;
1.19	(3) three members must be certified water supply system operators, appointed by the
1.20	commissioner of health, one of whom must represent a nonmunicipal community water
1.21	system or a nontransient noncommunity water system;
