1.3 defining terms; amending Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 13C.001, by adding
1.4 subdivisions; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 13C.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 13C.001, is amended by adding a
1.7 subdivision to read:

1.8 Subd. 1a. **Background check.** "Background check" means a review of data and
1.9 information maintained by government entities to determine whether a data subject
1.10 qualifies to obtain housing or perform a job. A background check is not a consumer report.

1.11 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 13C.001, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.12 to read:

1.13 Subd. 1b. **Business screening service.** "Business screening service" means a person
1.14 regularly engaged in the business of collecting, assembling, evaluating, or disseminating
1.15 criminal record information on individuals for a fee. Business screening service does not
1.16 include a government entity, as defined in section 13.02, or the news media. A business
1.17 screening service is not a consumer reporting agency.

1.19 to read:

1.20 Subd. 3a. **Data subject.** "Data subject" means the individual human being about
1.21 whom a background check is conducted.

2.9 **SUBJECT.**

2.10 (a) Prior to initiating a background check, an inquirer must give the data subject
2.11 written notice that a background check will be performed and, if a business screening
2.12 service is utilized, the name and address of that business screening service. The notice
2.13 must also describe the process for obtaining a written copy of the results from the inquirer.
2.14 The inquirer must provide a written copy of the results to the data subject upon request.
2.15 The inquirer may not charge a fee for the copy.

2.16 (b) This section does not apply to public employers regulated under chapter 364.
