1.7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 245A.06, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.9	Subdivision 1. Contents of correction orders and conditional licenses. (a) If the
1.10	commissioner finds that the applicant or license holder has failed to comply with an
1.11	applicable law or rule and this failure does not imminently endanger the health, safety, or
1.12	rights of the persons served by the program, the commissioner may issue a correction order
1.13	and an order of conditional license to the applicant or license holder. When issuing a
1.14	conditional license, the commissioner shall consider the nature, chronicity, or severity of
1.15	the violation of law or rule and the effect of the violation on the health, safety, or rights of
1.16	persons served by the program. The correction order or conditional license must state the
1.17	following in plain language:
1.18	(1) the specific factual conditions observed by the licensor that constitute a violation of
1.19	the law or rule;
1.20	(2) the specific law or rule violated;
1.21	(3) the time allowed to correct each violation; and
1.22	(4) if a license is made conditional, the length and terms of the conditional license, and
1.23	the reasons for making the license conditional.

2.1	(b) Nothing in this section prohibits the commissioner from proposing a sanction as
2.2	specified in section 245A.07, prior to issuing a correction order or conditional license.
2.3	(c) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), if the commissioner finds that the applicant or license
2.4	holder has failed to comply with an applicable law or rule and this failure does not imminently
2.5	endanger the health, safety, or rights of the persons served by the program, the commissioner
2.6	must only provide technical assistance to help correct the violation. If upon a subsequent
2.7	inspection, the commissioner finds that the applicant or license holder has failed to correct
2.8	the violation or has violated the same applicable law or rule again, the commissioner may
2.9	issue a correction order and an order of conditional license to the applicant or license holder.
2.10	This paragraph only applies to licensed child care centers and licensed family child care
2.11	providers.
2.12	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective the day following final enactment.
2.13	Sec. 2. DIRECTION TO COMMISSIONER; STANDARDIZED LICENSING VISIT
2.14	TIME LINES AND REQUIREMENTS.
2.15	The commissioner of human services must work with stakeholders to develop and
2.16	implement a standardized time line and standards of licensor conduct for inspections of
2.17	licensed family child care providers and licensed child care centers. The time line and
2.18	standards developed by the commissioner must clearly identify:
2.19	(1) the steps of a licensing visit;
2.20	(2) the requirements expected of licensors and license holders before, during, and after
2.21	the visit;
2.22	(3) the standards of conduct that licensors must follow during a visit;
2.23	(4) the rights of license holders;
2.24	(5) when and how license holders can request technical assistance; and
2.25	(6) how license holders can request additional review of an issue related to the visit from
2.26	someone other than the assigned licensor.
2.27	The time line and standards must be implemented by January 1, 2024.

2.30	The commissioner of human services must amend Minnesota Rules, part 9503.0030,
