1.8	Subdivision 1. Fund created. A reward fund for information on missing and murdered
1.9	Indigenous relatives is created as an account in the state treasury. Money appropriated or
1.10	otherwise deposited into the account is available to pay rewards and for other purposes as
1.11	authorized under this section.
1.12	Subd. 2. Reward. The director of the Office for Missing and Murdered Indigenous
1.13	Relatives, in consultation with the reward advisory group, is authorized to pay a reward to
1.14	any person who provides relevant information relating to a missing and murdered Indigenous
1.15	relative investigation.
1.16	Subd. 3. Reward advisory group. (a) The director of the Office for Missing and
1.17	Murdered Indigenous Relatives, in consultation with the stakeholder groups described in
1.18	section 299A.85, subdivision 5, shall appoint an advisory group to make recommendations
1.19	on paying rewards under this section. The advisory group shall consist of the following
