OFFICIAL STATUS

1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to public safety; making placement of residence addresses on a driver's
1.3 license optional; eliminating certain fees; establishing a computerized records
1.4 system and access requirements; amending Minnesota Statutes 2018, sections
1.5 171.07, subdivisions 1, 3; 171.11; 171.12, by adding a subdivision; 171.121.

1.6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.7 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.07, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

1.8 Subdivision 1. **License; contents and design.** (a) Upon the payment of the required fee,
1.9 the department shall issue to every qualifying applicant a license designating the type or
1.10 class of vehicles the applicant is authorized to drive as applied for. This license must bear:
1.11 (1) a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee; (2) the licensee's full name and date
1.12 of birth; ~~(3) either (i) the licensee's residence address, or (ii) the designated address under~~
1.13 ~~section 5B.05;~~ (3) a description of the licensee in a manner as the commissioner deems
1.14 necessary; ~~(5) (4) the usual signature of the licensee; and (6) designations and markings as~~
1.15 ~~provided in this section~~ (5) if the licensee requests, either the licensee's residence address
1.16 or designated address under section 5B.05. No license is valid unless it bears the usual
1.17 signature of the licensee. Every license must bear a colored photograph or an electronically
1.18 produced image of the licensee. If the residence or designated address is not displayed on
1.19 a licensee's license, the licensee's residence or designated address must be retained and
1.20 stored in the department's record system.

1.21 (b) If the United States Postal Service will not deliver mail to the applicant's residence
1.22 address ~~as listed on the license~~, then the applicant shall provide verification from the United
1.23 States Postal Service that mail will not be delivered to the applicant's residence address and
1.24 that mail will be delivered to a specified alternate mailing address. When an applicant

2.1 provides an alternate mailing address under this subdivision, the commissioner shall use
 2.2 the alternate mailing address in lieu of the applicant's residence address for all notices and
 2.3 mailings to the applicant.

2.4 (c) Every license issued to an applicant under the age of 21 must be of a distinguishing
 2.5 color and plainly marked "Under-21."

2.6 (d) A license issued to an applicant age 65 or over must be plainly marked "senior" if
 2.7 requested by the applicant.

2.8 (e) Except for an enhanced driver's license or a noncompliant license, a license must
 2.9 bear a distinguishing indicator for compliance with requirements of the REAL ID Act.

2.10 (f) A noncompliant license must:

2.11 (1) be marked "not for federal identification" on the face and in the machine-readable
 2.12 portion; and

2.13 (2) have a unique design or color indicator.

2.14 (g) A license issued to a person with temporary lawful status must be marked "temporary"
 2.15 on the face and in the machine-readable portion.

2.16 (h) A license must display the licensee's full name or no fewer than 39 characters of the
 2.17 name. Any necessary truncation must begin with the last character of the middle name and
 2.18 proceed through the second letter of the middle name, followed by the last character of the
 2.19 first name and proceeding through the second letter of the first name.

2.20 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.07, subdivision 3, is amended to read:

2.21 Subd. 3. **Identification card; content and design; fee.** (a) Upon payment of the required
 2.22 fee, the department shall issue to every qualifying applicant a Minnesota identification card.
 2.23 The department may not issue a Minnesota identification card to an individual who has a
 2.24 driver's license, other than a limited license. The department may not issue an enhanced
 2.25 identification card to an individual who is under 16 years of age, not a resident of this state,
 2.26 or not a citizen of the United States of America. The card must bear: (1) a distinguishing
 2.27 number assigned to the applicant; (2) a colored photograph or an electronically produced
 2.28 image of the applicant; (3) the applicant's full name and date of birth; ~~(4) either (i) the~~
 2.29 ~~licensee's residence address, or (ii) the designated address under section 5B.05;~~ ~~(5)~~ (4) a
 2.30 description of the applicant in the manner as the commissioner deems necessary; ~~(6)~~ (5) the
 2.31 usual signature of the applicant; and ~~(7) designations and markings provided under this~~

3.1 ~~section (6)~~ if the applicant requests, either the applicant's residence address or designated
3.2 address under section 5B.05.

3.3 (b) If the United States Postal Service will not deliver mail to the applicant's residence
3.4 address ~~as listed on the Minnesota identification card~~, then the applicant shall provide
3.5 verification from the United States Postal Service that mail will not be delivered to the
3.6 applicant's residence address and that mail will be delivered to a specified alternate mailing
3.7 address. When an applicant provides an alternate mailing address under this subdivision,
3.8 the commissioner shall use the alternate mailing address in lieu of the applicant's residence
3.9 address for all notices and mailings to the applicant.

3.10 (c) Each identification card issued to an applicant under the age of 21 must be of a
3.11 distinguishing color and plainly marked "Under-21."

3.12 (d) Each Minnesota identification card must be plainly marked "Minnesota identification
3.13 card - not a driver's license."

3.14 (e) Except for an enhanced identification card or a noncompliant identification card, a
3.15 Minnesota identification card must bear a distinguishing indicator for compliance with
3.16 requirements of the REAL ID Act.

3.17 (f) A noncompliant identification card must:

3.18 (1) be marked "not for federal identification" on the face and in the machine-readable
3.19 portion; and

3.20 (2) have a unique design or color indicator.

3.21 (g) A Minnesota identification card issued to a person with temporary lawful status must
3.22 be marked "temporary" on the face and in the machine-readable portion.

3.23 (h) A Minnesota identification card must display the cardholder's full name or no fewer
3.24 than 39 characters of the name. Any necessary truncation must begin with the last character
3.25 of the middle name and proceed through the second letter of the middle name, followed by
3.26 the last character of the first name and proceeding through the second letter of the first name.

3.27 (i) The fee for a Minnesota identification card is 50 cents when issued to a person who
3.28 is developmentally disabled, as defined in section 252A.02, subdivision 2; a physically
3.29 disabled person, as defined in section 169.345, subdivision 2; or, a person with mental
3.30 illness, as described in section 245.462, subdivision 20, paragraph (c).

4.1 Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.11, is amended to read:

4.2 **171.11 DUPLICATE LICENSE; CHANGE OF DOMICILE OR NAME.**

4.3 When any person, after applying for or receiving a driver's license, shall change
 4.4 permanent domicile from the address named in such application or in the license issued to
 4.5 the person, or shall change a name by marriage or otherwise, such person shall, within 30
 4.6 days thereafter, apply for a duplicate driver's license upon a form furnished by the department
 4.7 ~~and pay the required fee~~ or using the computerized records system under section 171.12,
 4.8 subdivision 1b. The application ~~or duplicate license~~ shall show both the licensee's old address
 4.9 and new address or the former name and new name as the case may be.

4.10 Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.12, is amended by adding a subdivision to
 4.11 read:

4.12 Subd. 1b. Computerized records system; access to address information. (a) The
 4.13 department must maintain a computerized records system of the residence address or
 4.14 designated address under section 5B.05 for all driver's license and identification card
 4.15 applicants.

4.16 (b) The record must be accessible online by applicants, who may use the system to
 4.17 change the residence address or designated address of record associated with the applicant's
 4.18 driver's license or identification card. In order to access the system, the applicant must
 4.19 provide the applicant's driver's license number or identification card number, birth date, and
 4.20 any other security code or measure the department deems appropriate.

4.21 (c) Subdivision 7 applies to the data maintained in the computerized records system
 4.22 under paragraph (a).

4.23 Sec. 5. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.121, is amended to read:

4.24 **171.121 USE OF ANOTHER'S RESIDENCE ADDRESS.**

4.25 A person may notify the commissioner in writing to the effect that the person: (1) is the
 4.26 owner of a residence; and (2) does not consent to have that residence address identified on
 4.27 any ~~driver's license or identification card or~~ driving record of the department as the residence
 4.28 address or permanent mailing address of any person named in the notice. The notice may
 4.29 not name a spouse of the notifying person. Upon receiving the notice the commissioner
 4.30 shall not issue any license or identification card under this chapter, or accept an application
 4.31 for a license or identification card under this chapter, that lists the residence address identified

5.1 in the notice as the residence address or permanent mailing address of any person named
5.2 in the notice.
