OFFICIAL STATUS

A bill for an act 1.1 relating to public safety; making placement of residence addresses on a driver's 12 license optional; eliminating certain fees; establishing a computerized records 1.3 system and access requirements; amending Minnesota Statutes 2018, sections 1.4 171.07, subdivisions 1, 3; 171.11; 171.12, by adding a subdivision; 171.121. 1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA: 1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 171.07, subdivision 1, is amended to read: 1.7 Subdivision 1. License; contents and design. (a) Upon the payment of the required fee, 1.8 the department shall issue to every qualifying applicant a license designating the type or 1.9 class of vehicles the applicant is authorized to drive as applied for. This license must bear: 1.10 (1) a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee; (2) the licensee's full name and date 1.11 of birth; (3) either (i) the licensee's residence address, or (ii) the designated address under 1.12 section 5B.05; (4) (3) a description of the licensee in a manner as the commissioner deems 1.13 necessary; (5) (4) the usual signature of the licensee; and (6) designations and markings as 1.14 provided in this section (5) if the licensee requests, either the licensee's residence address 1.15 or designated address under section 5B.05. No license is valid unless it bears the usual 1.16 signature of the licensee. Every license must bear a colored photograph or an electronically 1.17 1.18 produced image of the licensee. If the residence or designated address is not displayed on a licensee's license, the licensee's residence or designated address must be retained and 1.19 1.20 stored in the department's record system. (b) If the United States Postal Service will not deliver mail to the applicant's residence 1.21

address as listed on the license, then the applicant shall provide verification from the United
States Postal Service that mail will not be delivered to the applicant's residence address and
that mail will be delivered to a specified alternate mailing address. When an applicant

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2.1 provides an alternate mailing address under this subdivision, the commissioner shall use
2.2 the alternate mailing address in lieu of the applicant's residence address for all notices and
2.3 mailings to the applicant.

2.4 (c) Every license issued to an applicant under the age of 21 must be of a distinguishing
2.5 color and plainly marked "Under-21."

2.6 (d) A license issued to an applicant age 65 or over must be plainly marked "senior" if
 2.7 requested by the applicant.

(e) Except for an enhanced driver's license or a noncompliant license, a license must
bear a distinguishing indicator for compliance with requirements of the REAL ID Act.

2.10 (f) A noncompliant license must:

2.11 (1) be marked "not for federal identification" on the face and in the machine-readable2.12 portion; and

2.13 (2) have a unique design or color indicator.

2.14 (g) A license issued to a person with temporary lawful status must be marked "temporary"2.15 on the face and in the machine-readable portion.

(h) A license must display the licensee's full name or no fewer than 39 characters of the
name. Any necessary truncation must begin with the last character of the middle name and
proceed through the second letter of the middle name, followed by the last character of the
first name and proceeding through the second letter of the first name.

Subd. 3. Identification card; content and design; fee. (a) Upon payment of the required 2.21 fee, the department shall issue to every qualifying applicant a Minnesota identification card. 2.22 The department may not issue a Minnesota identification card to an individual who has a 2.23 driver's license, other than a limited license. The department may not issue an enhanced 2.24 identification card to an individual who is under 16 years of age, not a resident of this state, 2.25 or not a citizen of the United States of America. The card must bear: (1) a distinguishing 2.26 number assigned to the applicant; (2) a colored photograph or an electronically produced 2.27 image of the applicant; (3) the applicant's full name and date of birth; (4) either (i) the 2.28 licensee's residence address, or (ii) the designated address under section 5B.05; (5) (4) a 2.29 description of the applicant in the manner as the commissioner deems necessary; (6) (5) the 2.30 2.31 usual signature of the applicant; and (7) designations and markings provided under this

the commissioner shall use the alternate mailing address in lieu of the applicant's resid

	distinguishing color and plainly marked "Under-21."				
	(d) Each Minnesota identification card must be plainly marked "Minnesota identifica				
	card - not a driver's license."				
	(e) Except for an enhanced identification card or a noncompliant identification car				
	Minnesota identification card must bear a distinguishing indicator for compliance with				
	requirements of the REAL ID Act.				
	(f) A noncompliant identification card must:				
	(1) be marked "not for federal identification" on the face and in the machine-reada
