1.1 A bill for an act

relating to legacy; appropriating money from the outdoor heritage fund.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. APPROPRIATIONS.

The appropriations are from the outdoor heritage fund for the fiscal year indicated for each purpose.
