Requirements in this chapter governing the distance from which certain lamps and devices must render objects visible, or within which lamps or devices must be visible, apply during the time from sunset to sunrise on a straight level unlighted highway under normal atmospheric conditions unless a different time or condition is expressly stated. Unless otherwise specified, the location of lamps and devices refer to the center of the lamps or devices.

## 169.48 VEHICLE LIGHTING.

Subd. 2. **Certain violations; negligence.** Notwithstanding section 169.96, a violation of subdivision 1, paragraph (a), clause (2), is not negligence per se or prima facie evidence of negligence.
