1.11	Subd. 4. Limits on governor's peacetime emergency powers. A declaration of
1.12	peacetime emergency does not authorize the governor to:

1.16	(2) preclude the free movement of people or impose penalties for moving freely about

2.2	(a) It is unlawful for any employer to require an employee or applicant for employment

(c) For purposes of this section, "employer" means a person or entity that employs one or more employees in this state and includes an individual, corporation, partnership, association, nonprofit organization, group of persons, state, county, town, city, school district, or other governmental subdivision.

Sec. 4. [325D.73] REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN VACCINATION OR RECOVERY DOCUMENTATION UNLAWFUL.

- (a) In order to protect the fundamental rights and privacies of Minnesotans and the free flow of commerce within the state, it shall be unlawful for any person, partnership, firm, or corporation, foreign or domestic, doing business in the state to require patrons or customers to provide documentation certifying vaccination or post-transmission recovery to gain access to, entry upon, or service from the business.
- (b) Any business that violates the prohibition in this section shall be ineligible for grants or contracts financed through state revenue or funds.
- (c) The requirements in this section do not restrict businesses from instituting COVID-19
 screening protocols in accordance with state and federal law to protect the public health.
