1.5	Section 1. SOCIAL MOVABILITY PILOT PROGRAM; APPROPRIATION.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Appropriation. \$80,000 in fiscal year 2021 is appropriated from the
1.7	general fund to the commissioner of transportation for a grant to the Grand Rapids Area
1.8	Community Foundation for a social movability pilot program that provides transportation
1.9	services during evenings and weekends. This is a onetime appropriation.
1.10	Subd. 2. Goals. Goals of the pilot program include:
1.11	(1) promoting independence in daily living;
1.12	(2) enhancing quality of life; and
1.13	(3) decreasing social isolation.
1.14	Subd. 3. Program requirements. The pilot program must:
1.15	(1) serve an area that includes the city of Grand Rapids and a radius of 20 miles around
