1.7	Subd. 10. Certain persons needing treatment for breast or cervical cancer. (a)
1.8	Medical assistance may be paid for a person who:
1.9	(1) has been screened for breast or cervical cancer by the Minnesota any Centers for
1.10	Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection
1.11	Program (NBCCEDP)-funded breast and cervical cancer control program, and program
1.12	funds have been used to pay for the person's screening;
1.13	(2) according to the person's treating health professional, needs treatment, including
1.14	diagnostic services necessary to determine the extent and proper course of treatment, for
1.15	breast or cervical cancer, including precancerous conditions and early stage cancer;
