home care workers, whose names appeared
on any list of self-directed workers provided
to the persons seeking decertification by the
Department of Human Services or the Bureau
of Mediation Services between May 1, 2016,
and July 1, 2019, and who signed a card
between May 1, 2016, and July 1, 2019.
