1.9	Subdivision 1. Application. A subject of a birth record who is eligible for medical
1.10	assistance according to chapter 256B and who has been treated for a substance use disorder
1.11	within the last 12 months of application may apply to the state registrar or a local issuance
1.12	office for a certified birth record according to this section. The state registrar or local issuance
1.13	office shall issue a certified birth record or statement of no vital record found to a subject
1.14	of a birth record and waive all fees if the applicant meets the following conditions:
1.15	(1) a completed application signed by the subject of the birth record;
1.16	(2) a statement that the subject of the birth record is eligible for medical assistance
1.17	according to chapter 256B and has been treated for substance use disorder in the last 12
