1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. [216C.443] LOCAL CLIMATE PLANNING AND ACTION HUB.
1.8	Subdivision 1. Definition. For the purposes of this section, "eligible entity" means:
1.9	(1) a county, home rule charter or statutory city or town, the Metropolitan Council, a
1.10	regional development commission established under section 462.387, or any other local
1.11	political subdivision; or
1.12	(2) a Tribal government, as defined in section 116J.64, subdivision 4.
1.13	Subd. 2. Establishment. A local climate planning and action hub is established in the
1.14	Pollution Control Agency to serve as a resource for eligible applicants seeking to: (1) develop
1.15	and implement plans, policies, and projects to reduce local contributions to the causes of
1.16	climate change; and (2) adapt to the challenges posed by climate change.
1.17	Subd. 3. Duties. The duties of the local climate planning and action hub include, at a
1.18	minimum:
1.19	(1) making periodic geographic-specific data that measures local contributions to climate
1.20	change available to counties, Tribal governments, cities participating in the Pollution Control
1.21	Agency's GreenStep Cities program, and other cities with a population of 25,000 or greater;

- 3.5 (2) to pay the reasonable costs incurred by the agency to administer this section.
