1.6	Section 1. [121A.24] LICENSED SCHOOL COUNSELORS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Counselors. A school district shall provide adequate school counseling
1.8	services to its students. A school district may directly employ or contract for licensed school
1.9	counselors.
1.10	Subd. 2. Ratio. For the 2019-2020 school year and later, the ratio of students to licensed
