2.8	Subd. 4. Grant awards. When awarding grants under this section, the commissioner

2.16	Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION.
2.17	\$15,000,000 in fiscal year 2021 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner
2.18	of commerce to award commercial building energy efficiency grants under section 1. This
2.19	is a onetime appropriation. This appropriation remains available until December 31, 2022.
2.20	<b>EFFECTIVE DATE.</b> This section is effective the day following final enactment.
