BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA: 1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 216B.1691, subdivision 1, is amended to read: 1.6 Subdivision 1. **Definitions.** (a) Unless otherwise specified in law, "eligible energy 1.7 technology" means an energy technology that generates electricity from the following 1.8 renewable energy sources: 1.9 (1) solar; 1.10 (2) wind; 1.11 (3) hydroelectric with a capacity of less than 100 megawatts; 1.12 (4) hydrogen, provided that after January 1, 2010, the hydrogen must be generated from 1.13 the resources listed in this paragraph; or 1.14 (5) biomass, which includes, without limitation, landfill gas; an anaerobic digester 1.15 system; the predominantly organic components of wastewater effluent, sludge, or related 1.16 by-products from publicly owned treatment works, but not including incineration of 1.17 wastewater sludge to produce electricity; and an energy recovery facility used to capture 1.18 the heat value of mixed municipal solid waste or refuse-derived fuel from mixed municipal 1.19 solid waste as a primary fuel. 1.20 (b) "Electric utility" means a public utility providing electric service, a generation and 1.21 transmission cooperative electric association, a municipal power agency, or a power district. 1.22

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(c) "Total retail electric sales" means the kilowatt-hours of electricity sold in a year by an electric utility to retail customers of the electric utility or to a distribution utility for distribution to the retail customers of the distribution utility. "Total retail electric sales" does not include the sale of hydroelectricity supplied by a federal power marketing administration or other federal agency, regardless of whether the sales are directly to a distribution utility or are made to a generation and transmission utility and pooled for further allocation to a distribution utility.
