7.10	schools. Any appropriation of federal funds under this subdivision is a onetime appropriation.
7.11	Subd. 4. Expiration. This section does not apply to federal funds after the general fund
7.12	appropriations in this act have been reduced and federal funds have been appropriated for
7.13	the same purpose.
