1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 256B.0921, is amended to read:
1.8	256B.0921 HOME AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES HINCENTIVE
1.9	INNOVATION POOL.
1.10	Subdivision 1. Innovation pool established. The commissioner of human services shall
1.11	develop an initiative to provide incentives payments for innovation in:
1.12	(1) achieving integrated competitive employment for people eligible for publicly funded
1.13	home and community-based services;
1.14	(2) achieving integrated competitive employment for youth with disabilities under age
1.15	25 upon their graduation from school;
1.16	(3) living supporting and assisting people eligible for publicly funded home and
1.17	community-based services to live in the most integrated setting possible; and
1.18	(4) assisting home and community-based waiver service providers projected to receive
1.19	at least a ten percent decrease in revenue due to the transition to service rates calculated
1.20	under section 256B.4914 in developing innovative service delivery models; and
1.21	(5) other outcomes determined by the commissioner.

- The commissioner shall seek requests for proposals and shall may contract with one or
 more entities to provide incentive payments for meeting identified outcomes.
- 2.3 Subd. 2. Reports required. (a) Recipients of innovation incentive payments shall provide
- 2.4 <u>the commissioner with a report on the activities funded through the innovation initiative in</u>
- 2.5 <u>a format and at a time specified by the commissioner.</u>
- 2.6 (b) The commissioner shall provide the chairs and ranking minority members of the
- 2.7 <u>legislative committees with jurisdiction over human services with a biennial report</u>
- 2.8 summarizing and synthesizing all the activities and outcomes of the projects funded through
- 2.9 the innovation initiative. The biennial report is due on January 15 of each odd-numbered

APPENDIX Repealed Minnesota Statutes: 19-2971

256B.0658 HOUSING ACCESS GRANTS.

The commissioner of human services shall award through a competitive process contracts for grants to public and private agencies to support and assist individuals eligible for publicly funded home and community-based services, including state plan home care, to access housing. Grants may be awarded to agencies that may include, but are not limited to, the following supports: assessment to ensure suitability of housing, accompanying an individual to look at housing, filling out applications and rental agreements, meeting with landlords, helping with Section 8 or other program applications, helping to develop a budget, obtaining furniture and household goods, if necessary, and assisting with any problems that may arise with housing.
