1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 609.487, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.7	to read:
1.8	Subd. 3a. Fleeing officer; failure to obey signs. Whoever flees or attempts to flee by
1.9	means of a motor vehicle a peace officer who is acting in the lawful discharge of an official
1.10	duty, and the perpetrator knows or should reasonably know the same to be a peace officer,
1.11	and who in the course of fleeing in a motor vehicle does any of the following is guilty of a
1.12	felony and may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than five years or to payment
1.13	of a fine of not more than \$10,000 or both:
1.14	(1) fails to obey signs, signals, or markings in violation of section 169.06, subdivision
1.15	4, 4a, 4b, 5, 6, 7, or 8; or
1.16	(2) fails to keep on the proper side of the road in violation of section 169.18.
1.17	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2023, and applies to crimes
1.18	committed on or after that date.
