FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 170.231 - Display Learning Material

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** and the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from **Gordon Parks Elementary** stated there would be an impact but did not provide any additional information.

In response to the previous version, officials from **Hazelwood School District** stated it is difficult to assess the additional amount of time that would be required, and the resulting labor costs, to organize all materials in the manner being proposed. The district has approximately 1,200 teachers. Gathering individual lesson plans and then posting them in the manner described would be an enormous task. Additional staff would have to be hired just to coordinate such a requirement.

Oversight assumes there would be costs to school districts to collect and display all learning materials and education activities. Oversight assumes there would be costs for staff time and training as well.

Additionally, **Oversight** assumes there could be costs for legal services and attorney's fees if a district violates the provisions of this section.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill requires that beginning in the 2023-24 school year that all school districts and charter schools post on the school's website the approved school curriculum that will be used for pupil instruction. Any changes to the curriculum must be updated on the website within 30 days and notice must be provided in a form of written communication with parents. Any curriculum that is trademarked or copyrighted may not be widely disseminated to the public.

The bill outlines a cause of action to require that the school board comply and if any resident prevails in a cause of action the bill provides that attorney fees shall be paid up to \$15,000.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
