## **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

§§630.015; 630.055 and 630.1150 - Modifies provisions relating to the state Mental Health Commission

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health (DMH)** state this proposal modifies §§630.015 and 630.055 and adds §630.1150, pertaining to the state Mental Health Commission.

Section 630.015.2(5) contains new language and now reads "accessibility of services to promote timely treatment in the most efficient and efficacious setting of patients with mental illnesses, mental disorders, intellectual disabilities, and developmental disabilities".

Section 630.055 is modified to reflect the addition of the new section 630.1150. Section 630.1150.1 states that the commission shall oversee a project assessing hospitalization of foster children and "clients of the Division of Developmental Disabilities" that occurs because of the lack of post-discharge placement options or screening for residential services. It also tasks the commission with developing recommendations to ensure treatment in the most cost-effective and efficacious settings.

Section 630.1150.2 states the commission shall engage with the Missouri Institute of Mental Health for analysis and policy recommendations. It also provides the commission will collaborate with other state agencies.

Section 630.1150.3 states the commission shall solicit and consider recommendations for social workers, health insurers, psychiatrists and psychologists, hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, and others.

Section 630.1150.4 states the commission shall issue reports to director of DMH and copies of the report to the directors of MO HealthNet, the Children's Division, the Department of Social Services and the General Assembly. Section 630.1150.5 provides a sunset date of September 1, 2024.

DMH would require contracting with an outside vendor to perform the duties included in the proposed language. DMH estimates the cost for a vendor to provide these services would be greater than or equal to \$750,000 for FY 2023 and FY 2024.

**Oversight** does not have information to the contrary and therefore, Oversight will reflect the estimates as provided by DMH.

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Officials from the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Social Services, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Missouri Senate and the Office of Administration each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other nursing homes, schools and hospitals were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System database is available upon request.

# FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

### **FISCAL DESCRIPTION**

This bill provides the State Mental Health Commission shall oversee and implement a collaborative project to assess the incidence and implications of continued hospitalization of foster children patients with mental illnesses, mental disorders, intellectual disabilities, and developmental disabilities that occurs without medical justification because appropriate post-discharge placement options are unavailable or because they are awaiting screening for appropriateness of residential services. The Commission shall develop recommendations for the

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Director of the Department of Mental Health to ensure that such patients receive the most cost effective and efficacious treatment.

The Commission and the Department shall engage and collaborate with the Missouri Institute of Mental Health to evaluate programs and policies as necessary to develop recommendations for the Commission on policy or operational changes. The Commission shall further solicit and consider data and recommendations from stakeholders and subject matter experts as described in the bill.

The Commission shall issue interim reports to the Director of the Department before December 31, 2022, and before July 1, 2023, and a final report before December 1, 2023. In addition each report must be submitted concurrently to specified divisions of the Department of Social Services and the General Assembly.

The provisions of this section shall expire on September 1, 2024 (§§630.015; 630.055 and 630.1150).

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
