# FIRST REGULAR SESSION HOUSE BILL NO. 1025

## 98TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

## AN ACT

To repeal section 302.020 as enacted by senate bill no. 491, ninety-seventh general assembly, second regular session and section 302.020 as enacted by house bill no. 111, ninety-sixth general assembly, first regular session, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to wearing protective gear while operating a motorcycle.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 302.020 as enacted by senate bill no. 491, ninety-seventh general assembly, second regular session and section 302.020 as enacted by house bill no. 111, ninetysixth general assembly, first regular session, RSMo, are repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 302.020, to read as follows:

302.020. 1. Unless otherwise provided for by law, it shall be unlawful for any person,except those expressly exempted by section 302.080, to:

3 (1) Operate any vehicle upon any highway in this state unless the person has a valid4 license;

5 (2) Operate a motorcycle or motortricycle upon any highway of this state unless such 6 person has a valid license that shows the person has successfully passed an examination for the 7 operation of a motorcycle or motortricycle as prescribed by the director. The director may 8 indicate such upon a valid license issued to such person, or shall issue a license restricting the 9 applicant to the operation of a motorcycle or motortricycle if the actual demonstration, required 10 by section 302.173, is conducted on such vehicle;

(3) Authorize or knowingly permit a motorcycle or motortricycle owned by such personor under such person's control to be driven upon any highway by any person whose license does

not indicate that the person has passed the examination for the operation of a motorcycle ormotortricycle or has been issued an instruction permit therefor;

15 (4) Operate a motor vehicle with an instruction permit or license issued to another 16 person.

17 2. Every person operating or riding as a passenger on any motorcycle or motortricycle, 18 as defined in section 301.010, upon any highway of this state shall wear protective headgear at 19 all times the vehicle is in motion, **except as provided in subsection 3 of this section**. The 20 protective headgear shall meet reasonable standards and specifications established by the 21 director.

3. Any person who is twenty-one years of age or older and who is a resident of a state that does not require protective headgear to be worn while operating or riding as a passenger on any motorcycle or motortricycle may operate or ride as a passenger on such motorcycle or motortricycle in this state between August first and August twenty-first each year without wearing protective headgear.

27 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 302.340 any person convicted of violating subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 1 of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor. A first violation 28 29 of subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 1 of this section shall be punishable as a class D 30 misdemeanor. A second violation of subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 1 of this section shall 31 be punishable as a class A misdemeanor. Any person convicted a third or subsequent time of 32 violating subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 1 of this section is guilty of a class E felony. 33 Notwithstanding the provisions of section 302.340, violation of subdivisions (3) and (4) of subsection 1 of this section is a misdemeanor, the first violation punishable as a class D 34 35 misdemeanor, a second or subsequent violation of this section punishable as a class C misdemeanor, and the penalty for failure to wear protective headgear as required by subsection 36 37 2 of this section is an infraction for which a fine not to exceed twenty-five dollars may be imposed. Notwithstanding all other provisions of law and court rules to the contrary, no court 38 39 costs shall be imposed upon any person due to such violation. No points shall be assessed 40 pursuant to section 302.302 for a failure to wear such protective headgear. Prior pleas of guilty 41 and prior findings of guilty shall be pleaded and proven in the same manner as required by section 558.021. 42

Every person operating or riding as a passenger on any motorcycle or motortricycle, 18 as defined in section 301.010, upon any highway of this state shall wear protective headgear at 19 all times the vehicle is in motion, **except as provided in subsection 3 of this section**. The 20 protective headgear shall meet reasonable standards and specifications established by the 21 director.

3. Any person who is twenty-one years of age or older and who is a resident of a state that does not require protective headgear to be worn while operating or riding as a passenger on any motorcycle or motortricycle may operate or ride as a passenger on such motorcycle or motortricycle in this state between August first and August twenty-first each year without wearing protective headgear.

27 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 302.340 any person convicted of violating 28 subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 1 of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor. A first violation 29 of subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 1 of this section shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed three hundred dollars. A second violation of subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 1 of this section 30 31 shall be punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed one year and/or 32 a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars. Any person convicted a third or subsequent time of 33 violating subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 1 of this section is guilty of a class D felony. 34 Notwithstanding the provisions of section 302.340, violation of subdivisions (3) and (4) of 35 subsection 1 of this section is a misdemeanor, the first violation punishable by a fine not to 36 exceed three hundred dollars, a second or subsequent violation of this section punishable as a 37 class C misdemeanor, and the penalty for failure to wear protective headgear as required by 38 subsection 2 of this section is an infraction for which a fine not to exceed twenty-five dollars may be imposed. Notwithstanding all other provisions of law and court rules to the contrary, no court 39 40 costs shall be imposed upon any person due to such violation. No points shall be assessed 41 pursuant to section 302.302 for a failure to wear such protective headgear. Prior pleas of guilty 42 and prior findings of guilty shall be pleaded and proven in the same manner as required by section 558.021. 43
