AN ACT

To repeal section 41.050, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to organized militia age requirements.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 41.050, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 41.050, to read as follows:

41.050. The militia of the state shall include all able-bodied citizens and all other able-bodied residents, who, in the case of the unorganized militia and the Missouri state

defense force, shall be more than seventeen years of age and not more than sixty-four, and

4 such other persons as may upon their own application be enrolled or commissioned therein,

5 and who, in the case of the organized militia, shall be within the age limits, but not less than

6 twenty-one years of age, and possess the physical and mental qualifications prescribed by

7 law or regulations for the reserve components of the Armed Forces of the United States,

8 except that this section shall not be construed to require militia service of any persons

9 specifically exempted by the laws of the United States or the state of Missouri. The

10 maximum age requirement may be waived by the adjutant general on a case-by-case basis.
