

# HOUSE BILL NO. 1156

### AN ACT

To amend chapter 590, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the use of body-worn cameras by law enforcement.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Chapter 590, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 590.1060, to read as follows:

- 590.1060. 1. There is hereby established in the department of public safety the "Task Force on Body-Worn Cameras".**
- 2. The task force shall consist of twenty-three members, appointed as follows:**
- (1) The director of the department of public safety or his or her designee;**
  - (2) Two members of the house of representatives, with one member appointed by the speaker of the house and one member appointed by the minority leader of the house;**
  - (3) Two members of the senate, with one member appointed by the president pro tempore of the senate and one member appointed by the minority leader of the senate;**
  - (4) One member representing the governor's office;**
  - (5) Two members representing the Missouri association of prosecuting attorneys;**
  - (6) One member representing the Missouri state public defender system;**
  - (7) One member representing the Missouri association of criminal defense lawyers;**
  - (8) One member representing the American Civil Liberties Union of Missouri;**
  - (9) One member representing the Missouri POST commission;**
  - (10) One member representing the Missouri police chiefs association;**

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets ~~thus~~ in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

18           **(11) Four members who are police chiefs, at least two of whom shall be from**  
19 **local law enforcement agencies that have deployed body-worn cameras;**

20           **(12) One member who is a law enforcement officer;**

21           **(13) One member representing a local government entity responsible for the**  
22 **oversight of law enforcement;**

23           **(14) One member representing the Missouri sunshine coalition;**

24           **(15) One member representing the news media;**

25           **(16) One member representing a victims' advocacy group; and**

26           **(17) One member representing the general public.**

27           **3. Within thirty days of the task force's creation, the director of the department**  
28 **of public safety or his or her designee shall convene the first meeting of the task force for**  
29 **the purpose of establishing bylaws and electing officers, to include a chair, vice chair,**  
30 **and secretary. Members may be reimbursed for expenses but shall not receive a per**  
31 **diem allowance.**

32           **4. The task force shall examine the use of body-worn cameras by law**  
33 **enforcement and may request such information, recordings, and other records from**  
34 **agencies as the task force deems appropriate for it to effectuate this section.**

35           **5. The task force shall deliver a report of recommendations to the governor and**  
36 **members of the general assembly no later than December 31, 2023.**

37           **6. The provisions of this section shall expire on December 31, 2029.**

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
