AN ACT

To amend chapter 650, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the establishment of a program on police officer presence in schools and communities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 650, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 650.466, to read as follows:

650.466. 1. There is hereby established in the department of public safety a program on police officer presence in schools and communities to increase positive social interaction between youth and law enforcement officers and to develop a harmonious rapport between the two entities. The department of public safety shall focus its efforts on establishing programs, projects, activities, and events in communities located in a county with a charter form of government and with more than nine hundred fifty thousand inhabitants that contain school districts with a total minority student population that exceeds fifty percent.

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2. The department of public safety shall:

10 (1) Conduct studies on local, statewide, and national programs with demonstrated 11 success at increasing positive social relationships between law enforcement agencies and 12 youth;

(2) Make recommendations to law enforcement agencies, communities, and schools
as to programs, projects, activities, and events that will aid in developing a harmonious
rapport between law enforcement officers and youth;

(3) Advise the commissioner of education and the department of education on issues
relating to the establishment of community relations programs in communities located in

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a county with a charter form of government and with more than nine hundred fifty
thousand inhabitants that contain school districts with a total minority student population
that exceeds fifty percent;

(4) Make recommendations for a state plan for community education that sets forth the goals and objectives of a community relations program and establishes a system of priorities for targeting available resources on the areas with the greatest need within a school district;

(5) Make recommendations for establishing community schools within communities
containing community relations programs; and

(6) Make recommendations for the funding of local community relations programs
and projects, activities, and events that will aid in developing a harmonious rapport
between law enforcement officers and youth.

30 **3.** For purposes of subsection 2 of this section, "community school" means a school 31 that makes its facilities available for citizen use, coordinates activities of local citizens in 32 identifying program needs and establishing priorities, identifies and utilizes available

33 program resources, and assists in the initiation of programs to improve the cultural, social,

34 recreational, and educational opportunities available in a community.

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
