### AN ACT

To amend chapter 590, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to law enforcement agency policies regarding interactions with minors.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 590, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 590.515, to read as follows:

590.515. 1. Before January 1, 2020, every law enforcement agency in this state shall adopt a written policy regarding interactions with minors. Policies adopted shall ensure that all minors are treated equally regardless of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, disability, or familial status. Policies adopted shall outline a process for:

- (1) Field interrogations and preliminary investigations involving offenders who are minors;
- (2) The consent of minors when in contact, searching, questioning, or otherwise interacting; and
- 10 (3) The arresting of offenders who are minors, which shall include post-arrest medical screening and requirements that parents or guardians be contacted after officer contact with minors.
  - 2. Policies adopted shall require a report to be made after each incident involving a minor.
- 3. Law enforcement agencies shall take the following into account when crafting each aspect of the policy required under this section:
