AN ACT

To repeal sections 50.327 and 58.095, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to the compensation of county coroners.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 50.327 and 58.095, RSMo, are repealed and two new sections 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 50.327 and 58.095, to read as follows:

50.327. 1. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, the salary schedules contained in sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 51.281, 51.282, 52.269, 53.082, 53.083, 2 54.261, 54.320, 55.091, 56.265, 57.317, [58.095,] and 473.742 shall be set as a base schedule 3 for those county officials. Except when it is necessary to increase newly elected or reelected 4 county officials' salaries, in accordance with Section 13, Article VII, Constitution of Missouri, 5 to comply with the requirements of this section, the salary commission in all counties except 6 charter counties in this state shall be responsible for the computation of salaries of all county 7 8 officials except county coroners; provided, however, that any percentage salary adjustments in 9 a county shall be equal for all such officials in that county excluding the county coroner.

2. Upon majority approval of the salary commission, the annual compensation of part-time prosecutors contained in section 56.265 and the county offices contained in sections 49.082, 50.334, 50.343, 51.281, 51.282, 52.269, 53.082, 53.083, 54.261, 54.320, 55.091, [58.095,] and 473.742 may be increased by up to two thousand dollars greater than the compensation provided by the salary schedules; provided, however, that any vote to increase compensation be effective for all county offices in that county **excluding the county coroner**.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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16 3. Upon majority approval of the salary commission, the annual compensation of a 17 county sheriff as provided in section 57.317 may be increased by up to six thousand dollars 18 greater than the compensation provided by the salary schedule of such section.

4. The salary commission of any county of the third classification may amend the base schedules for the computation of salaries for county officials referenced in subsection 1 of this section to include assessed valuation factors in excess of three hundred million dollars; provided that the percentage of any adjustments in assessed valuation factors shall be equal for all such officials in that county **excluding the county coroner**.

58.095. 1. The county coroner in any county not having a charter form of government
shall receive an annual salary [computed on a basis as set forth in the following schedule. The
provisions of this section shall not permit or require a reduction in the amount of compensation

17 in an amount determined by the county commission.

18 2. One thousand dollars of the salary authorized in this section shall be payable to the 19 coroner only if the coroner has completed at least twenty hours of classroom instruction each 20 calendar year as established by the coroner standards and training commission unless exempted 21 from the training by the Missouri Coroners' and Medical Examiners' Association for good cause. 22 The Missouri Coroners' and Medical Examiners' Association shall provide a certificate of 23 completion to each coroner who completes the training program and shall send a list of certified 24 coroners to the treasurer of each county and the department of health and senior services. The 25 coroner standards and training commission may certify training programs that satisfy the 26 requirements of this section in lieu of the training provided by the Missouri Coroners' and 27 Medical Examiners' Association. Certified training completion shall be submitted to the 28 Missouri Coroners' and Medical Examiners' Association which, upon validating the certified

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training, shall submit the individual's name to the county treasurer and department of health and senior services indicating the individual is compliant with the training requirements. Expenses incurred for attending the training session may be reimbursed to the county coroner in the same manner as other expenses as may be appropriated for that purpose. All elected or appointed coroners, deputy coroners, and assistants to the coroner shall complete the annual training described in this subsection within six months of election or appointment.

35 3. The **annual compensation of the** county coroner in any county not having a charter 36 form of government shall not[₅] **be less than the annual compensation of the preceding year** 37 except upon two-thirds vote of all the members of the [salary] county commission[, receive an 38 annual compensation in an amount less than the total compensation being received for the office 39 of county coroner in the particular county for services rendered or performed on the date the 40 salary commission votes].

[4. For the term beginning in 1997, the compensation of the coroner, in counties in which 41 42 the salary commission has not voted to pay one hundred percent of the maximum allowable 43 salary, shall be a percentage of the maximum allowable salary established by this section. The percentage applied shall be the same percentage of the maximum allowable salary received or 44 allowed, whichever is greater, to the presiding commissioner or sheriff, whichever is greater, of 45 46 that county for the year beginning January 1, 1997. In those counties in which the salary commission has voted to pay one hundred percent of the maximum allowable salary, the 47 48 compensation of the coroner shall be based on the maximum allowable salary in effect at each 49 time a coroner's term of office commences following the vote to pay one hundred percent of the 50 maximum allowable compensation. Subsequent compensation shall be determined as provided 51 in section 50.333. 52 5. Effective January 1, 1997, the county coroner in any county not having a charter form

53 of government may, upon the approval of the county commission, receive additional 54 compensation for any month during which investigations or other services are performed for 55 three or more decedents in the same incident during such month. The additional compensation 56 shall be an amount that when added to the regular compensation the sum shall equal the monthly 57 compensation of the county sheriff.]

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
