AN ACT

To amend chapter 643, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to certain air pollution sources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 643, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 643.194, to read as follows:

643.194. 1. Sources required to file an annual emissions inventory questionnaire with the department that emit thirty pounds or more of mercury annually shall be required to pay an annual fee to the department of natural resources of one thousand dollars per pound of mercury emitted.

5 2. The department of natural resources shall collect all fees required under this 6 section and may retain a percentage of such fees necessary to administer the collection and 7 allocation of such fees. The remaining portion of such fees shall be remitted to the bureau 8 of special health care needs within the department of health and senior services.

9 3. The department of natural resources may promulgate rules to implement the 10 provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective 11 12 only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if 13 applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of 14 the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held 15 16 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2017, shall be invalid and void. 17
