AN ACT

To amend chapter 620, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to the regulatory improvement commission.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 620, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto two new sections, to be known as sections 620.3150 and 620.3220, to read as follows:

620.3150. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any comprehensive state energy plan developed by the division of energy shall be adopted and implemented only upon the approval of such plan by the general assembly by concurrent resolution.

620.3220. 1. There shall be created within the department of economic development the "Regulatory Improvement Commission".

- 2. The commission shall consist of the following members:
- (1) One member appointed by the governor who shall serve as the chairperson of the commission;
- 6 (2) Two members appointed by the president pro tem of the senate;
 - (3) Two members appointed by the minority leader of the senate;
 - (4) Two members appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and
- 9 **(5)** Two members appointed by the minority floor leader of the house of 10 representatives.

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A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum. The members shall establish bylaws for the commission. Members of the commission shall serve without compensation, but shall be entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties. The commission shall be staffed by personnel from the department of economic development as deemed necessary to assist the commission in the performance of its duties.

- 2. The commission shall evaluate and provide recommendations for modification, consolidation, or repeal of regulations with the aim of reducing compliance costs, encouraging growth and innovation, and improving competitiveness.
- 3. The commission shall submit a report to the governor and general assembly no later than December 31, 2016 detailing the commission's findings and recommendations.
- 4. The commission shall dissolve after the submission of its report. This section shall expire December 31, 2017.

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
